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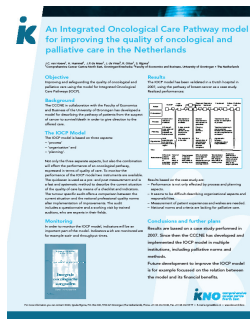


## Definition Integrated Oncological Care Pathways

- "A logical interconnected group of individual care processes which a patient with a specific oncological disease passes from first request for care till survivor or decease. These care processes can be medical and/or emotional and include both cure and care activities"(CCNE, 2009)

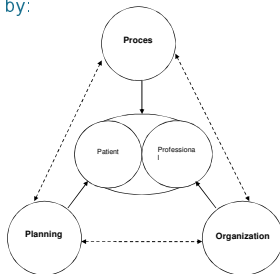


## Results of the case study

- Oncological care process is fragmented

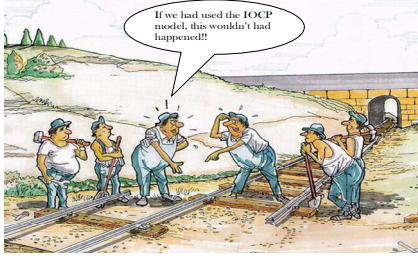
