## Admissions Considerations

- Three+ years of relevant experience in a clinical setting
- Ability to perform graduate work as demonstrated by **one** of the following:
  - Previous graduate degree or at least 9 credits of appropriate graduate-level coursework with grade of B or higher as evaluated by WES or ECE or other international transcript evaluation service recognized by Jefferson
  - Earned baccalaureate degree with approximate GPA of 3.5 (B+) or higher as evaluated by WES or ECE or other international transcript evaluation service recognized by Jefferson
- Demonstration of English language proficiency via **one** of the following:
  - Native English speaker from designated country
  - Baccalaureate degree or higher from an accredited U.S. college or university
  - U.S. national/state licensure or certification in medicine, nursing or allied health
  - Appropriate scores on *Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)* or *International English Language Testing System (IELTS)*
- Competency in medical terminology demonstrated by **one** of the following:
  - Clinical degree/clinical coursework
  - Undergraduate/graduate coursework in medical terminology
  - Passing score on Jefferson medical terminology qualifying test
- Competency in basic statistics demonstrated by **one** of the following:
  - Undergraduate/graduate coursework with grade of B or higher
  - Passing score on Statistics.com exam or JCPH statistics qualifying test

## Application Process

- Completion of online application form
- Submission of official transcripts plus WES or other evaluation service
- Submission of TOEFL or IELTS scores, if applicable
- Two letters of recommendation (submitted in English)
- Personal essay
- Online (SKYPE) or phone interview
